Memorial Day:

The Library will be closed Monday, May 28th in observance of Memorial Day.

We understand how busy summers can be, so we have created a program that children 2 and up can participate in whenever the library is open. Child Safety in the Library:

Library policy is that children under the age of 10 must be with a parent or adult caregiver (18 years or older).

We work hard to create a warm and welcoming atmosphere for families, and are very happy to see how many of our patrons feel comfortable here. All children need the chance to practice independence, but it is never safe to leave a young child alone in a public place. It is important to remember that the Library is a public building, and

while the risk may be small, it would only take a minute for a child to be placed in a vulnerable position. Safety precautions that are routine when parents take children to a mall or playground should not be relaxed just because it is a library.

Children under the age of 10 should never be dropped off at the library, sent *alone* from the car to return books (that is why we have a drive-up book drop), left on one floor of the library while the parent is on another, or in any other way left unsupervised by the parent or caregiver.

Library staff cannot provide child care nor can they assume responsibility for supervising unattended children.
