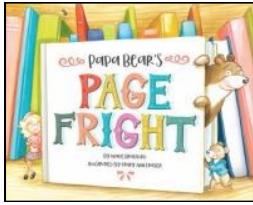
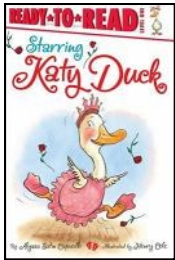


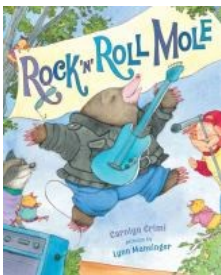
# Stage Fright



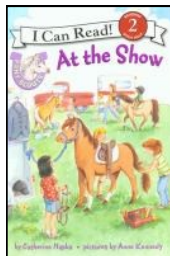

## Stage Fright



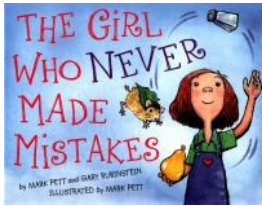
