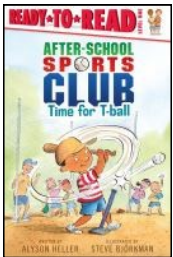


Gikow, L. The Big Game. A child who has trouble with some of the soccer skills finds an important role as goalie. jE Gikow

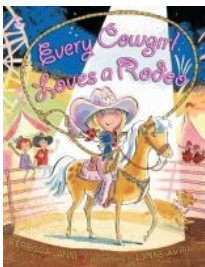
